Environmental organisations are faced not only with direct pressure from authorities. Other actors are also taking part in this repression, such as state-sponsored mainstream media, big corporations and government controlled non-governmental organisations.

Elena Shendera: The Campaign to support Ali Feruz in Russia

The story of the campaign to support of Ali Feruz (real name Khudoberdi Nurmatov), that began on August 1st 2017. Ali Feruz is a journalist working for

Novaya Gazeta, openly gay, who was sentenced to deportation to Uzbekistan, where he can face the worst: prison and torture. Now Ali is in the SUVSIG (Special institution for the temporary detention of foreign citizens). On August 8th, the Moscow City Court suspended the deportation judgment given on August 1st and decided that in order to extradite him it would be necessary to complete the proceedings involving the journalist's complaint to the ECHR.

The main demand of the campaign is to release journalist Ali Feruz and to grant him asylum in Russia or allow him to leave to an EU country, that is ready to host him.

Andrei Ozharkovskiy: What is Rosatom and How to Stop It? - an interactive workshop

Saturday 6 January: 4:30 PM — 6:00 PM

The Russian State Nuclear Corportation Rosatom is quite active both at home and worldwide - it promotes nuclear energy, builds reactors, provides nuclear fuel. Its activity creates numerous risks: environmental, economic, radiological, etc.

In 2014 Rosatom acquired 34% of the Finnish company, Fennovoima, and started trying to build a new reactor at the Hanhikivi Cape. Locals and activists started a protest campaign, there were rallies, protests camps at the site, etc.
